

OPEN LETTER TO DEMOCRATIC PARTY LEADERSHIP

Dear Representative Jeffries, Senator Schumer, & Mr. Martin,

First, thank you for your distinguished service to our country as Democratic Party leaders and for standing up for our interests and values at these critical times!

Today - along with over **750 activists, donors, and concerned citizens** - we are reaching out to you at a time when we essentially have one-party rule and a President who is running roughshod over the Constitution and the Rule of Law. Given the pace of developments, **it is past time for the Democratic Party and you as its leaders to step it up and become a true opposition party.** Democrats must establish what the Party stands for and what it stands against - and then invite and welcome others to join with us, including Republicans who feel unsafe and unable to speak up against Trump and Musk.

We need the Party to **immediately** take these actions to enable all of us to save our country:

1. **Create a war room and a shadow cabinet** of senior Party and elected Democrats, to **craft the opposition strategy, advance bold policies, spearhead the Party's legal strategy and coordinate Party communications** - forcefully responding to Trump's actions through the news cycle.
2. **Create an overarching narrative** that defines what the democratic party is **for**. This narrative should acknowledge that the system/government has not been working for many people. should include a plan that is **new, positive, honest, and simple** — understandable by all and that can be communicated in short statements.
3. **Communicate, Communicate, Communicate!** Disseminate key messages and stories of those affected by Trump's actions consistently and repeatedly through multiple channels. Be very clear about what impacts are and will be felt by everyday Americans because of Trump's policies. Radically ramp up the use of social media – cultivate & activate influencers, flood the internet with memes and short videos telling our story, and create instant response capabilities in the same news cycle to counter White House propaganda. Engage community and local news outlets to both learn about what is happening on the ground and share key messages.
4. **Reach out and listen** to engage and energize both activists and the broader public. Hold town halls, constituent meetings, and go door-to-door to learn what people care most about and let them know what they can do to make their voices heard.
5. **Revamp the Party's fundraising strategy.** Please **no more asks** without a clear strategy and communication as to how the funds will be used. **Inspire** people to give because they are aligned and on board with what the Party stands for and what we are doing now to make things better for their lives and for our country.

Examples of potential strategies and tactics to implement these actions are described in the addendum. **We are here to support you and eager to help mobilize others to do the same.**

ADDENDUM: EXAMPLES OF POTENTIAL STRATEGIES & TACTICS

The signers as of April 8th are listed below. Please share this letter with others. As more sign on, we will send updates with the names of those calling for immediate, bold action.

A WAR ROOM TO SPEARHEAD THE OPPOSITION

Composed of senior DNC and elected Democrats, the war room is to be charged with developing the opposition strategy, formulating and vetting policy positions, coordinating party actions and communications, and being nimble and responsive to the news cycle and Trump actions. As part of this effort, **establish a shadow cabinet** and **bring new blood** into the fold to provide leadership and articulate positions for different agencies (Energy, EPA, Health, Commerce etc.)

- Appoint a shadow press secretary and a rotating cast of elected and non-elected spokespersons who communicate clearly.
- Put forward as the face of the Party, younger plain-spoken leaders.
- Plot actions to oppose bad things and support good ones:
 - Identify actions that Congressional and Senate Democrats will do
 - That states can do
 - That rank-and-file Party Members and those opposed to Trump can do.
- Organize and guide the Party's legal strategy, coordinating with other organizations that are also filing lawsuits to challenge the Trump administration's illegal actions.
- Ramp up the use of Mitch McConnell-type legislative tools to delay, obstruct, and showcase the destructive Trump & Congressional Republican policies. They worked to frustrate the Obama and Biden agendas and should be deployed to thwart the Republicans.
- Explain decisions being made regarding legislation and how they fit into a strategy – for example, if you vote for the CR, explain *why* and what your plan is...

People on the ground are longing for your thoughts about where and how they can help; they want to do something and, as we've seen at town halls and in other forums, they are taking action. But leadership will be essential to transform this anger and energy into policy and political wins that turn the tide. Give people actions that they can take and a way to feel like they are part of a movement. For example, send updates about what is happening in the House and Senate and give people specific legislation about which to call Representatives and Senators. Confirm that calling *does* make a difference or give people different ideas if it doesn't.

POLICIES THAT CONNECT

Put forward bold, concrete policy proposals that people can easily and directly connect to their lives. Emphasis should be placed on people's kitchen table issues, especially the stress they are feeling financially.

- Start offering policies that are entirely new and different. *Please stop being so cautious!* Experiment with policies and see what lands. Shake things up. Be bold. For example, consider actually talking about climate change, in creative, concrete, and nonpartisan ways that help people understand the impacts they are seeing. Offer a *vision* about how we can handle this and what our world *could* look like.
- Focus on policies that will fix the problems people face day in and day out. Please don't focus on policies that upset the fewest people — we can't please everyone! Develop new policies, rather than just advocating for old ones. For example, universal healthcare is a great policy but needs to be paired with novel efforts focused on fixing broken systems.
- Be crystal clear about how these policies differ from those being pursued by the Trump administration and the Republicans – and how the policies will benefit working families, the middle class, and advance our values and national security across the globe.

A NARRATIVE THAT RESONATES

An **overarching narrative** will serve to communicate the Party's opposition to Trump's actions and articulate what the Democratic Party stands **for** not just against. This narrative must acknowledge that the system/government has not been working for many people. It must include a plan that is *new, positive, honest, and simple* — understandable by all and that can be communicated in short statements. Key values to be distilled down into a short, compelling, comprehensive narrative are likely to include some version of the examples below:

- We are **FOR the constitutional order and the Rule of Law** – everyone gets treated fairly.
- **We are FOR helping working families** – not enriching billionaires.
- We are **FOR** a government that meets the needs of working people and the middle class not oligarchs. We are against excessive wealth in politics.
- **We strive to create opportunity for all** and to build a better future for America, through public and private sector investment in advanced technologies, essential infrastructure, jobs and training for the jobs of tomorrow, and a healthy, clean environment.
- We are **FOR** treating workers and people everywhere **respectfully** and with **dignity**. We are **AGAINST** the **cruelty** that characterizes so many of Trump's actions – firings, cutting off aid, treating people inhumanely. Americans are not cruel people! We generously give to others when times are tough, or crises happen. Cruelty is not one of our values.
- We are **FOR** protecting the health of all Americans and **FOR** making access to good healthcare available and affordable to all.
- We are **FOR** smart solutions to increase efficiency, reduce waste, and get rid of any and all fraud. We are **AGAINST** gutting the federal workforce.
- We are **FOR** tax policies where everyone pays their fair share. We are **AGAINST** Trump's job killing, inflationary tariffs.
- **We are FOR and will be vigilant in protecting our national security and advancing democratic values and freedoms around the world.** We are **AGAINST** befriending autocrats and dictators.
- We are **FOR** investing in science, education, and innovation. We are **AGAINST** cuts to research and other programs that threaten our global leadership in these spheres. We support investing in USAID programs that associate our flag with hope, freedom, health, and well-being.

Our key messages must be powerful enough to counter Trump memes like 'Eliminating the "Deep State" and getting rid of "Waste, Fraud, and Abuse"'...

The Winning Jobs Narrative (www.winningjobsnarrative.org) could be a good place to start for developing this narrative. Other resources, among many, include Antonia Scatton with Reframing America and George Lakoff and Gil Duran with FrameLab.

A COMMUNICATIONS STRATEGY THAT BREAKS THROUGH

Disseminate key messages consistently and repeatedly.

- The Democratic Party homepage and every Democratic congressional website and Facebook page or equivalent should have a banner across the top with the Democrats' key messages – the narrative and the message of the day or week.
 - These should consist of the overarching narrative, how the district or state is being adversely affected, and what this means for real people on the ground.
 - Send out blast texts and emails communicating the Party's key messages,
- Hold regular (daily/weekly) press conferences and briefings, in parallel to the White House – including going to locations where Trump's policies and EO's are hurting people and America. Make these newsworthy attention-getting events.

Develop and tell stories about how Trump/Musk actions affect real people, real lives, and especially their pocketbooks.

- Flood social and regular media with these stories – tied to our narrative so people get it. For example, share photos and stories of individual people who have been fired by Trump/Musk on Instagram and elsewhere. Be relentless in sharing these stories.
- Create a hot line, Instagram page, BlueSky thread, or the like where people who have been hurt by Trump actions can tell their stories, confidentially as required. Curate and disseminate these stories.
- Communicate positive actions the Party is taking and plans to take in response.
- Ask that people receiving these messages share them broadly through their networks.

Dramatically ramp up the use of social media.

- Cultivate and invest in social media influencers to receive and amplify the Party's key messages through their networks as well as spread the real-life stories of how people's lives are being affected by Trump actions.
- Identify and utilize new social media content creators/influencers such as Chorus, the Better Internet Initiative, and Courier Newsroom.
- Hire a team of gen Z folks and AI experts to create a rapid response capability matching what comes out of the White House and to share stories and messages using social media. In short order we need to be able to go toe-to-toe with the emerging White House propaganda machine. Experiment with different strategies and tactics.

- Consider hiring a Republican communications firm...
- Engage and leverage new "blue media" organizations such as DemCast and Meidas Touch Network
- Stop using anti-Trump and anti-Musk rhetoric as your main organizing message. We all get they are BAD; we are tired of being anti - give us a "FOR" to orient around instead. Test out which "FORs" gain the most traction.
- Please stop ceding ground to the right in new media. Build a better bullhorn to counter Joe Rogan and the like dominating podcasting information with half-informed, grievance-driven programming. Invest in and prep a farm team of credible "entertaining" voices to engage the disaffected and misdirected Z voters in normal relatable conversations that support democratic values

Rise above partisanship in communicating opposition to Trump's actions and support for American values.

- We are in a fight for our democracy, the future of our country, and the values we hold dear – as well as our jobs and economic security/opportunity. Instead of blasting Republicans in swing districts telling their voters how bad they are – which probably pushes them more and more into the Trump camp – articulate what we are for and ask them to stand with us. Change up the messaging! The enemy is the Trump right wing and the oligarchs that are seeking to take over our country, not the Republican moderates. Let's try to get more of them on our side as we need them to stand up for America. The time will come to take them out and win back the House and Senate – but now is not the time to lead with such naked partisanship – as if all we care about is the fight...

OUTREACH, ORGANIZE AND EMPOWER

Don't be a distant DC-based party: GO to communities and listen. Be active in those communities; find ways to help out.

- As part of building a policy platform and integral to the communications strategy, visit communities across the country. Use town halls, community gatherings, and canvassing to gather information about what is on people's minds, what will actually help them, and what systems change they would like to see. Also use these forums to grow and test out new Democratic leadership and policies. Focus these gatherings on helping and listening to people. Especially in rural places, ask people what will address their needs.
- Gather the key themes and messages from talking with people "out there" and bring those back into the narrative building, communication, and policy experimentation effort.
- Identify and engage next-gen leaders; listen to their voices and include them in the opposition movement.
- Deploy these tactics, proposed by Norm Ornstein ([This Is No Time for the Democrats to Hang Back | The New Republic](#)):
 - Do town meetings and hold office hours in Republican districts and states.
 - Add field hearings to the town halls. E.g., go to rural hospitals and hold field hearings on their dependence on Medicaid. Go to Texas and hold hearings on the measles outbreak.
- *Trump is actively hurting people. Could the Democratic party offer services and support in the wake of the devastation he is causing? Ask DNC members to donate to the cause.*

CHANGE UP PARTY FUNDRAISING

All the Democrats we know – young and old - are totally turned off by the barrage of emails and texts from all sorts of Democrats asking for money. A key reason - few of the asks include anything about what the party is doing to change its approach and address the current threat to our country.

- **Think big!** In the blast emails that the DCCC sends out, we are asked to contribute \$6-\$250, to win back only 3 seats in the next cycle to regain the House majority and approximately 9 competitive house seats have been identified as targets. If Trump has his way and, as a result, the country faces a crisis and the economy tanks, there will surely be many more races in play in the next election cycle. Let's aim for higher than 3!
- **Please inspire and lead us with higher ambitions.** Let's contest seats all over the country to protect our democracy, maintain the rule of law, adhere to the values that truly make us great, and enact policies and reforms that indeed create opportunity, security, and well-being for all.

*In closing, as Norm Ornstein puts it: "**Perilous times demand bold action**". We cannot continue with business as usual when the rule of law, our democracy, the foundations of our economy, the well-being of millions of Americans, and ultimately the world order are threatened. As Democrats and Americans, we will support you – and are counting on your leadership - for the re-creation of the Democratic Party as both a shining light for the future and an increasingly powerful and growing home for all Americans who oppose the Trump – Musk regime.*
